What to expect Travel by coach to this excellent Museum at Burton on Trent in the old Bass Brewery - dwarfed by the giant modern Coors Brewery next door. If social history (especially of workers and the pub trade,) brewing history, vintage delivery vehicles, horses, stationary steam engines, steam railways and even pub games are among your interests then this for you. And have you ever thought how India Pale ale got to India? I have booked the 2 hour Kilderkin Guided Tour where amongst other things we can get close and personal with the Museum's dray horses - watching them being prepared and if the weather is good having a ride on the dray!

Getting there Leave Goring station at 0815 for the 2.5 hour run to Burton arriving c 1045.

Return We will finish our tour (with the Horse presentation) at 1300 . Then lunch. After lunch you will have time to explore. I anticipate leaving at 1530 giving us an 1800 arrival at Goring and Streatley

Costs Coach will cost us £25 per head (based on 25 people). The tour, tea and coffee on arrival and lunch will cost £22 each. The charge will include drinks tokens to be exchanged for cold soft drinks or a selected cask ale .
